



Conditions of Access

The **first condition of access** to BattleKart is height: participants must be **at least 145 cm tall** to safely access the controls.

In case of doubt, the staff reserves the right to check the height of any player (without their shoes) using a measuring stick, and to refuse them access to the game if they do not meet the minimum height.

The second condition of access is **physiological and psychomotor control of the go-kart**. It is necessary that participants have sufficient psychomotor reflexes to use the acceleration, braking and steering controls.

If our track staff determine that a player's lack of control could create a potential risk for the other players, the staff and/or the equipment, the Multiwex Management authorises them to interrupt the game and escort the player in question to the podium area.

Additionally, our go-karts are not suitable for people who do not have mobility in both legs. On a physical level, it is necessary that players have control over both braking and steering, so a player who has mobility in at least their left leg and right arm could potentially access the activity, under certain conditions and after verification by our track staff.

Restrictions

The BattleKart activity is subject to several restrictions:

- People with epilepsy, people with back and neck issues, and pregnant people are prohibited from participating in the activity;
- The activity is not recommended for people with heart disease;
- Although the go-karts have passed all the EMV tests - German version of the electromagnetic compatibility (EMC) tests - we do not recommend that people with a pacemaker take part in the activity because of the magnetic field produced by the motors;
- We recommend that people with sensitive eardrums wear hearing protection;
- Access to the activity may be difficult and uncomfortable for people with larger bodies (whose hips may not fit into the seat);
- Participating in the activity under the influence of alcohol or narcotics is prohibited.

Safety rules

Finally, there are several safety rules that must be respected before and during the activity:

- Long hair must be tied up (hair ties may be available);
- Glasses must be secured if they are to be worn during the activity (cords may be available);
- Loose clothing or scarves that could get caught in the wheels of a go-kart are prohibited;
- Keep your arms and legs inside the go-kart throughout the session;
- Do not cause physical contact between go-karts;
- Do not touch the go-kart chargers;
- Do not enter the track as a pedestrian;
- Do not enter the stands without the operator's permission;
- Do not get into or out of your go-kart without the operator's permission.
